

Sand Bowls

Supplies Included:

1. Sand (color may vary)
2. Glue, 4 oz. in 2 pots

Supplies Needed:

1. Small bowl: the exact dimension aren't important, but mine was 6 inches wide and 2 inches deep. Do not use paper or other flexible bowls.
2. Plastic wrap
3. Mixing bowl or cup



Instructions

1. On a surface you don't mind getting messy, turn your small bowl upside down and cover the bottom with plastic wrap. This will be your mold. Try to keep the plastic wrap as smooth as possible; any wrinkles will show in your finished product. (Fig. 1)
2. Pour the sand into your mixing bowl. Add glue from one of the two plastic pots provided little by little, mixing as you go, until the mixture resembles a thick paste. You may not need the whole pot of glue--I used 2 tablespoons. The mixture should not be runny. (Fig. 2)



Instructions

3. Spread the mixture over the plastic wrapped upside-down bowl. You may not need all of the mixture, but spread it thickly enough that there are no holes. Let dry fully (this may take overnight). (Fig. 3)
4. Once your bowl is fully dry, spread some of the glue from the second pot in a thin layer over the bottom of the bowl to act as a sealant. Let dry. (Fig. 4)
5. When that layer is dry, flip your sand bowl over, off the mold. Remove any plastic wrap still clinging. Spread a thin layer of glue to the inside of your sand bowl. Let dry.
