



Fabric Bowl

Teen-To-Go

Step 1: Gather your supplies. You should have 2 fabric swatches (20"x12" each), a paper bowl, container of Mod Podge, and a foam brush. You will need plastic wrap, a small cereal bowl, a ruler, and scissors from home.


Step 2: Begin by covering the outside of a small cereal bowl with plastic wrap. Make sure the bowl is completely covered as this is the mold for your bowl. You may also want to line your workstation with plastic wrap.

Step 3: Using scissors, cut the fabric into 1.5 to 2 inch wide strips.

Step 4: Pour the Mod Podge into the paper bowl and thin slightly with a spoonful of water.

Step 5: With the bowl flipped upside down, begin brushing on the Mod Podge in a two inch wide strip from edge to edge. Lay a strip of fabric over the Mod Podge. If you are using a printed fabric, make sure it is print side DOWN. Keep adding Mod Podge and fabric until the bowl is covered.

Step 6: Using the same technique add the other strips of fabric onto the first layer. If your fabric is printed, this time place it print side UP. Continue covering the bowl with fabric. Using all your remaining Mod Podge to smooth and secure the fabric.

Step 7: Allow the fabric bowl to completely dry overnight.

Step 8: Once completely dry, remove the fabric bowl from the mold (upside down cereal bowl) and peel the plastic away. Using scissors, trim the edge of the bowl so that it is even.
